Ground breaking tax cut to support jobs

Mark has welcomed the bold new tax cut for businesses and employers in Milton Keynes North which takes effect from the 6th April.

A new Employment Allowance will take £2,000 off the National Insurance bill of every employer â€" open to businesses, charities and community amateur sports clubs. This will take 68,000 small businesses in the South East region out of having to pay any tax on jobs at all.

Employers will be able to hire one extra person on £22,400 a year, or four people working full time on the minimum wage, without paying any National Insurance.
