

PM Praises Staff at Milton Keynes University Hospital

The Prime Minister heaped praise on Milton Keynes University Hospital and its staff for improving clinical standards.Â

The praise came during Prime Minister's Questions as MP for Milton Keynes South, Iain Stewart highlighted the hospital's plans to open a new ward, the building of the purpose-built teaching facility for doctors, opening later this year Â and the imminent start of a cancer care unit.
