

Hospital makeover gets Mark's support

Employees at John Lewis Milton Keynes have been honing their decorating skills this November, as they take part in a volunteer project to makeover the Children's Outpatients Unit at the hospital.

For a week starting on November 27, staff members from John Lewis, as well as the YMCA and Bedford charity SportsTraider, have been redeveloping the Children's Outpatients Unit, to enhance the facilities for younger patients and their families.

The Children's Outpatients Unit sees as many as 40,000 children every year, some of whom have long term conditions such as asthma and cystic fibrosis. The project will make a huge difference to both patients and their families, who regularly visit the unit for check-ups, clinics and assessments.
